Jeanne Gibson said that she'd sent cards to Laura Altman, Eleonore Norman, JoAnne Sube, Marie Berggren on behalf of the Honored Ladies. Jeanne does such a wonderful job of keeping track of those in distress or who have illness.

Under Unfinished Business we determined to change June 2012's date to the 23rd. Rose Enyeart moved that we make the date change to the third Saturday permanent. Eleonore Norman seconded it. It passed.

Under Good of the Order we had a talk from Potentate Allan Ake. First Lady Linda was visiting her parents in Phoenix and was unable to attend. IS Bob Burr gave us a hospital update. Each hospital has been charged to trip and examine budgets to pare them down as far as possible. In most hospitals there are beds that are not being used. The plans are to cooperate with neighboring hospitals. Minneapolis has moved to a shared space. Many hospitals do only day surgery. As we are aware Shrine hospitals now accept third party billing. We need to remember to say that care is provided regardless of ability to pay. There are issues with co-pays. Hospitals are working to make things move as smoothly and carefully as they always have. IS Bob reported that Salt Lake City is cutting back on their Mexican patients as tensions grow along the border. The Mexican government is now asking for patients to have a visa to come for help.

A side note. At the Daughters of the Nile Supreme Session, Ruhamah was recognized as the top temple in donations to supporting the hospitals. We are proud.

Ill. Sir Bob Burr

“The Imperial Potentate’s Award of Merit is awarded for an individual’s outstanding achievements and selfless and extraordinary contributions to the heritage, culture or mission of the Shrine or Freemasonry; to the mission of the Shriners Hospitals; or for the good of his local community in a manner that reflects positively on Freemasonry and the Shrine.”

Illustrious Sir Bob Burr was born in the Adirondacks up in northern New York, graduated from high school in Port Leyden in 1952 and went immediately into the Air Force. He worked in Materiel Control where he became familiar with purchasing for and supplying his unit. After bouncing from Korea, Okinawa, France, Thailand and places in the United States he retired with the rank of Master Sergeant in 1972. For the next 8 years Bob relied on that training in the private sector, providing his expertise to several companies including Traffic Data Systems where he purchased the “guts” for traffic control lights.

In 1980 he found himself working for Martin Marietta in Denver as their Senior Buyer and for 4 years enjoyed anonymity. Then he began his travel up the supervisory ladder and finally found himself as the Procurement Manager for the Space Launch Program involving Titan Missiles until he retired in 1992...again. After traveling with Betty for about 18 months he got a call one day and was back to work, this time with Honeywell in Colorado Springs, until 1997 when he retired a 3rd time. “I QUIT”.

During this 3rd retirement he was contacted by Ill. Sir Earl Aldrich and accepted the 1998 First Ceremonial Master position which kept him busy in the Divan through



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Potentate in 2003. While in the line Bob worked with Public Relations, Membership, and sold ads for the Basketball Tournament and The Dust. He took those positions seriously as he is still deeply involved with membership and ads for both those venues. He has been Al Kaly Membership Chairman 1998 to 2010 and is this year the Co-Chairman with JD Potter. He was, also, Membership Chair for the Grand Lodge of Colorado 2008-2009 and for Southern

Colorado consistory 2005 through the present.

Dust and Basketball Tournament ads still go through Bob who assures they are charged, printed and credited correctly.

In 2003 Bob visited 45 Blue Lodges in Southern Colorado and was instrumental in obtaining several new members from their ranks.

His Shrine affiliations include 4 Shrine Clubs including Colorado Springs, Legion of Honor, Secretary/Treasurer of CABIRI (the Past Potentate’s association), Sponsor of the Honored Ladies, and member

of the Clowns of Al Kaly...did we mention he was a clown? When asked if he had hobbies he answered without hesitation, “Clowns”. Any others? “Clowns”. Other than clowns? “Clowns”. I stopped asking.

In March 1976 Bob was approached by a group of clowns who put a petition in his hand and the rest is history as they say. He was originally “a clown” and Boss Clown in 1980, then six years in he had Betty make him a new costume, changed his make up and name and “Nickels” was born. Tens of thousands of wooden nickels later he is still the “Nickels” we all recognize and kids all love. He does

35 plus appearances yearly including showing grade school children how the make up and costume transform him. One small boy once told him he looked a lot better with make up than he did before...

hmmmm. In the persona of Nickels, Bob has been Clown of the Year for the Clowns of Al Kaly five times, has attended 24 consecutive East-West Games in costume and has found the time to visit 13 Shrine hospitals.

Digressing a bit we find Bob joined the Masonic Lodge March 25, 1963 becoming a Master Mason May 27, 1963 at Niagara River Lodge #785, Niagara Falls, New York; joined the Scottish Rite in May 1967, the Shrine in 1967, and York Rite.

On top of all this he has a home life. New Year's Eve 1953 he was at an NCO Program where several other people were also attending. At 2 minutes until midnight and the welcome of 1954 he found himself pinned against a wall with the edge of a table which had been pushed toward him. Immediately a young lady named Betty asked if he was ever going to ask her to dance...and 58 years later they are still dancing together. They dated through 1953 and early 1954 when Bob was sent to Korea and Okinawa; on his return in September 1955 they became engaged while in Chicago and were married September 1, 1956.

During the next 7 years four children joined them—first was Robert who graduated from the US Naval Academy in 1981 and worked on submarines for many years. He

retired in 2000 and lives in California working in the electric power field. He and his wife have 2 kids. Rhonda came along and made the Coast Guard her home for 7 years, then married Mark, and now lives in San Diego; they have 3 children.

Third was Rita who attended the USAF Academy in the 4th class which allowed women. She graduated in 1983 after being a 6-time All American runner in cross country and track. She was selected to go to medical school and graduated as a pediatrician. Dr. Rita Burr was instrumental in setting up the Tele-medicine program for Al Kaly with her husband Dr. Patrick Burns who provided no cost space for the program until its move in 2004. They live in Colorado Springs with their 2 children.

Then came Wendy who graduated from the University of Northern Colorado as a Registered Nurse, has 2 kids and is living in Redding, CA with her family.

Bob has attained many awards through his Masonic and Shrine career. He has amassed

over 46,000 points in Al Kaly Temple for his attendance, work and other help; he was Al Kaly Noble of the Year 1997; is Past Potentate of 2003; our representative to the International Shrine Board of Governors to the Salt Lake City Hospital since 2005; attained the 32nd Degree in York Rite in 1996; 32nd Degree in Scottish Rite in 2005 and 33rd Degree in 2008; and in 2008 also was presented the Imperial Potentate's Award of Merit.

Thanks Bob for all you do for Freemasonry, Al Kaly Shrine and Shriners International.







MID-YEAR FINANCIAL STATUS

We've completed the 1st half of 2011, and as I promised, my article this month is on our mid-year financial status.

I'm pleased to be able to report that in the general fund, we are tracking very close to what we've budgeted for the year. I extend my heartfelt thanks to all who've assisted with the activities so far this year. We currently show a net operating surplus of \$21,520. While this may seem that we're doing very well, the fact is that Al Kaly generates nearly 65% of our income in the first 6 months of the year, but over 53% of our expenses occur in the last half of the year. We are on-track to finish the year slightly in the black, but we need our upcoming fundraisers to be successful to meet our goals.

In the Transportation Fund, our expenses have exceeded our income by about \$874. We've spent almost \$10,000 getting our patients to the various Shriners Hospitals, down from about \$20,000 last year at this time. Our Telemedicine clinics are up and running. These are important in that 12 to 15 patients can be seen in a single day for follow-up appointments that would otherwise require the parents to take a couple days off from work to go to Salt Lake City. Each of those patients would most likely require travel assistance, so you can see we could easily be spending over \$4,000 in travel costs for the kids seen at a single telemedicine clinic. In addition to the travel savings, the folks at Unlimited Abilities are allowing us to conduct these clinics at their facility "free of charge". A big thank you to them!

We're doing a great job of helping the children of our communities! Keep it up!

Dues Increase. Remember at our September 9, 2011 stated meeting we are voting on a \$3.00 dues increase to help offset operating expenses.

Shriners Hospitals for Children® patients Alissa Perkins, 2, of Las Vegas and Kate Hickman, 13, of Houston have been selected as the health care system's national patient ambassadors for 2011-2012. As patient ambassadors, Alissa and Kate represent the thousands of children Shriners Hospitals for Children care for every year. Alissa Perkins

When Alissa Perkins was born, doctors diagnosed her with fibular hemimelia, a shortening or absence of one of the two bones in the calf, which may require amputation or bone-lengthening procedures. After Alissa's great-grandmother suggested the family consider consulting Shriners Hospitals for Children, they attended a PGA Tour event in their area that benefited the health care system. At the event, Alissa's mother spoke with Katie Walker, a former patient with a prosthetic leg. Katie was more than happy to share her phenomenal experiences at Shriners Hospitals for Children, including the expert care,



physical therapy and customized prosthetics provided by the hospital. Alissa ultimately had her left leg amputated and a follow-up surgery performed last year at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Los Angeles. She received her first prosthesis right before her first birthday in July and was walking a month later.

Kate Hickman

Five years ago, Kate Hickman, then 8, sustained second and third degree burns on 45 percent of her body when a candle flame ignited the hem of her dress. Kate's father rushed her to a local hospital in Houston, Texas, but the emergency room staff there did not feel able to give Kate all the care she needed, so they referred her to Shriners Hospitals for Children – Galveston, a hospital noted for expertise in pediatric burn care. Kate underwent multiple skin grafts and reconstructive surgeries to improve her condition. She also received extensive physical therapy and was able to regain full range of motion. Today, Kate, 13, is an energetic student who enjoys singing, acting, participating in sports and spending time with her family and friends. She was named the October 2009 "Memorial Buzz Kid," an honor given to outstanding youths in the Houston area.

President Homer Sharpton gave a welcome speech and the festivities continued during the day on June 27th, 1948. Also in attendance and smiling from ear-to-ear was Charles Boaz, Chair of the Money Raising Committee; Moran Skinner, Chief Solicitor; Verne Neely, Chair of the Building Committee; Earl Deits, Architect; and Bud Neely, Jim Jackson and Clarence Carlson, members of the Building Committee. Trustees Carl Decker, Leon Snyder and Walter Heck rounded out the dignitaries.

The Big Hall was built in 1952 and the stage, office and handicap restroom have been added since then. The current Shrine Club is available both to the public and Shriners for graduations, receptions and other meetings and events as well as for Shrine Club meetings.

June 27, 2008 a celebration of the 60th anniversary of the building was held with the Vice Mayor of Colorado Springs, who presented an Award to the club at that time, in attendance. Also celebrating the anniversary were 2 original students of the Arensdale School who still live across the street from the building.

The third Wednesday of each month you are welcome to visit this beautiful building at the monthly meeting of the Colorado Springs Shrine Club. 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
CLUB AND UNIT NEWS
