

JOHN LARSON

John Larson



John was born in Harlingen, Texas and went to a Lutheran School through the 8th grade. He went to high school - first in Texas then California and back to Texas where he played trumpet in the school marching band. Because he lived near South Padre Island, he also belonged to the Sea Scouts. John's parents had cats... very large Siamese cats. The biggest would go in the yard

and, find a stray dog, stalk it and chase it off.

John's grandfather was in the Spanish-American war. Before he was shipped to the Philippines he buried a small barrel of wine at the Presidio. Never could find it again! So, somewhere on the Presidio, there is a buried treasure!

Grandfather was, also, a game warden with the National Audubon Society on Green Island near Port Isabel, Texas owned by the Society as a bird sanctuary. After his grandfather passed away, John's father became the warden that summer. His dad rebuilt the cabin on the island where John spent a lot of his youth. At the age of 15, a man who owned a commercial fishing bait stand asked John and a friend of his to operate his bait stand while he was having some surgery. John continued working as a commercial fisherman summers through the remainder of high school. The Audubon Society asked John's dad to open a sanctuary for ducks in Marin County California. They provided the family a donated and restored Victorian house on 11 acres outside Tiburon. It sat on a bluff overlooking the bay with a view of San Francisco.

John completed 2 years of College at Marin Junior College in Kentfield. He lettered two years on the tennis team and as statistician for the basketball team.

He attended Pan American College (now the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley) in Edinburg, 10 miles from McAllen where he graduated with a BA in Astro-science and minors in math and history. At Pan American they didn't have It was not unusual to see a pickup truck in the parking lot with a couple of rifles in the gunrack.

When John was 5 or 6 he would go shooting with a friend of his parents and got his first rifle when he was 8 which he still has!

After graduation John accepted a job in satellite operations with Lockheed Missiles and Space at the Satellite Test Center (Onizuka AFS) in Sunnyvale, CA, for about 10 months until

the job became Civil Service; he spent 20 years working for the Department of the Air Force and held several positions. He worked on a nuclear detection satellite program managing the team of contractors; then for several years in the scheduling branch, controlling all the tracking stations and satellites which was 24/7 shiftwork. John's last job was Chief of Program Requirements in the Engineering Branch where he was the contact for Air Force Satellite Control Network, launch operations, for highly classified satellites. He traveled every other week, many trips highly classified so couldn't even tell his boss where he was going - and he had to sign John's orders! He couldn't travel out of the country without permission; and after he left the position was on a 5 year travel restriction.

While he was in Sunnyvale a man was sent up from LA to oversee things and while talking to him one day, John discovered his uncle and John's father went to high school together in Harlingen, TX! Small world!!!



Sunnyvale looked like it was going to be closed, so John started looking around. Another manager had gone to work for IBM and told John to shoot him a resume. He interviewed in Colorado Springs and they hired him right away to work at Schriever AFB. So he and Eileen packed up and moved here. He wasn't young enough to retire, so he took his pension account to buy their house. They still live in the same house.

Here he held several positions including team lead with hardware and software engineers supporting a major computer system at Schriever and a staff position to a 2nd line manager; John says his main job was keeping the Air Force happy. The last position he held was as a Subcontract Program Manager with responsibility for all the subcontractors. As the result of a series of company buyouts, he ended up working for Lockheed Martin where he retired after 24 years of service.

He met Eileen in 1969 in San Jose. At a large apartment complex there was a common area with garden and pool. John was girl watching at the pool where Eileen and her girlfriend were and, of course, John had to go talk to them! After marriage in 1971, 47 years ago, he and Eileen spent two months of leave touring Europe. They are members of the Elks and Sons of Norway; Eileen is a retired teacher and they have one daughter, Shannon, who has been married for 2 years. John and Eileen have a 6 year-old German Shepherd, Sasha, who loves to play with the Siamese cat (who is not crazy about Sasha).

One day, while waiting outside Shannon's ballet class, John was talking to a man who, it turns out he was from Edinburg, Texas. John drove past his house every day going to school! Again, a small world.

When her feet were big enough to fit the smallest pair of skates, she started skating and skated competitively through grade school and high school for the Broadmoor Skate Club. John was president of the Flivvers for a year and is also a member of the Pipe and Drum Corps. At Tom Holmes' urging, John has been a Hospital Representative since 2009 and has been a Potentate's Aide since 2013. He has been Secretary of the Public Relations Committee for several years and is starting his second term on the Colorado Springs Shrine Club Board of Directors.

When John read the article on Larry Weed, he discovered that his sister went to the same college as Larry. Another small world tidbit. John's sister is a college professor and has been doing genealogy on their family. She found there is a connection to the Armstrongs in Ohio where Neil Armstrong is from. John says it's fun to say they might be related.

His memorial service was on Friday, November 2, at Imperial Gardens and Nobles Vern Wolf, John Montoya, Brian Bate, Jim Marcum, and Tracy Howard participated in his Masonic Service.


