Featured Member
**Jack "Doc"
Cotton**

“Larger than Life”. That seems to cover Jack “Doc” Cotton. Considering all the accomplishments he has made in life and the fact he is 6 foot 8 inches tall... he is larger than life in every aspect.

“Doc” was born October 25, 1924 in Miles City, Montana, the fifth of eight children in the family. He attended school there and at 14 ran away from home and hopped a freight train. Aboard that train he met two World War I veterans who befriended the teenager and taught him the ways of the railroad. After instructing Jack how to ride the boxcars comfortably and safely, one of the vets inadvertently made the one mistake he had drilled into the young rider and had part of his foot cut off during the ride. Remember: never dangle your feet outside the car while in motion.

That freight train went through Yakima, Washington where Jack got off and went to work picking apples. Tex, King of Tramps, whose “TKT” became famous nationwide where it was signed on train cars and fences as he travelled, was also picking apples at this time and became a friend of the young man. After these experiences Jack returned to Miles City and graduated from high school in 1942 then joined the Navy and served his country proudly.

While finishing his education he worked one summer for Barnum and Bailey Circus helping set up tents and other “behind the scene” jobs when they appeared in Miles City. During that period he recognized two other hands and realized the World War I veterans who had become friends with him aboard the freight train were also working with the circus. They were able to renew their 3-year old friendship for the summer before the circus moved on.

Serving in the Navy he became an electrician and worked in that capacity in such far-away places as Guadalcanal, then the Marianas, the Philippines and Nagasaki, Japan before returning to the United States in 1946.

About the time of his discharge he bumped into a Nurse Cadet named Mabel who had studied diligently and was eagerly waiting for commission and orders to serve her country. As fate would have it the war ended and she was never able to serve. However, the tall young man she met



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earlier proposed on New Year's Eve and they were married July 27, 1947 and are still together 63 years later. As with all families, Doc and Mabel's began to grow. In 1949 daughter Jackie was introduced, followed by sons Kelly in 1952 and Todd in 1956. Mabel has stayed busy with her family and as a nurse doing everything from obstetrics to Director of Nursing at a nursing home. Jackie lives in Colorado Springs now while her brother Kelly is a minister in Denver. Kelly graduated 7th of 800 from Princeton and has authored several books as well as speaking yearly at Princeton on the relationship between religion and science/medicine. Todd is now the webmaster at Casper College in Casper, Wyoming.

Jack earned his Bachelor and Masters degrees from Denver University and worked with Dr. James Naismith, Athletic Director at Kansas University, the inventor of basketball.

His next accomplishment was being on the first organized major league team of any sport in Colorado, the Denver Nuggets Basketball team, from 1948 to 1950 while driving a cab part-time. He then moved to coaching basketball and baseball and was assistant coach of the football team at Dodge City, Kansas High School 1950 to 1953 moving to Southwestern College in Winfield, Kansas from 1953 to 1955. While at Southwestern College he again coached basketball, baseball and football.

In 1955 the University of Nebraska at Omaha signed Coach Cotton for their basketball team as well as tennis and assistant football coach. He stayed there in that capacity for four years and then took time to return to his own education. In 1960, he graduated from the University of Wyoming with a PhD in Education and Psychology. At this time he was recruited by Dr. Fred Plachy at Adams State College in Alamosa as their Athletic Director, men's and women's basketball coach and, again, assistant football coach. He is quick to tell he was, also, the bus driver. During his tenure at Adams State he was also a full-time educator teaching whatever subject was needed.

Highlights of his ASC career include the 1963 and 1964 National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) men's championships; recognition of women's basketball in 1980 and a nine year career of 164 wins/66 loses until 1989; four women's RMAC (Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference) championships and five NAIA championships with an undefeated year (16-0) in 1985; being one of the top ten NAIA coaches in 1989, his last year of basketball coaching; and recruiting Lonnie Porter, current coach at Regis College, who is considered the "winningest coach in Colorado history".

While coaching golf, "Doc" tutored Greg Condon who became a professional golfer and played on the Nike tour. He

reminded me that many golfers wear two pair of pants...in case they get a hole in one.

Doc was on the Olympic Committee from 1960 to 1972, including the year they found the 1968 Olympics were to be held in Mexico City. After some heavy-duty studies which were presented to the Olympic "fathers", Alamosa and ASC won the training ground for those athletes and set both on the Olympic "map".

Busy years were filled with running the Top of the Nation Basketball Tournament which hosted teams from eight states; Top of the Nation coaching clinic with speakers such as Barry Switzer and John McLendon; Spring Fest and Rapid's Race on the Rio Grande; being president of NAIA Coaches Association; participating on the Olympic Committee 1960-72 and running the High Altitude Training for the 1968 games and Sand Dunes Shrine Club President in 1975. Doc is a life member of the VFW, American Legion, Elks (Past Exalted Ruler and District Deputy for the Grand Exalted Ruler), Phi Delta Kappa, Sigma Chi, the Masons and the Shrine. He is currently active as Chairman of the Alamosa Seniors, Retired



Senior Volunteer Program, State Chairman for Youth Activities of the Elks, President of the Board of Directors for Home Lake Veterans Home as well as Masonic activities and Shrine events. Doc was one of the top sellers of Shrine Circus tickets until his health prohibited him from walking downtown Alamosa and Monte Vista chatting with store owners. He still attends and has yet to miss a performance. According to Jack, "I've been on every damn thing."

The Masons became his family in 1956 and he proudly holds his 50 year pin with them. He joined the Shrine in 1972 during a literal hot sands. That year the initiation ceremonial was held at the Sand Dunes and live camels were brought in for the event. Because of his busy life style and obligations, Doc never chose a specific unit but supported all he could, just being a Shriner "Jack of All Trades". (No pun intended, I'm sure!)

Doc is in the Adams State College Hall of Fame and on June 26, 2010 was inducted into the RMAC Hall of Fame in Colorado Springs. He is a prostate cancer survivor having put up with radiation five days a week for eight weeks, has rods in his back and sports two new hips yet he plays golf every day. We are proud to call him one of our own.

We have sold approximately 1,440 Cash Calendars for the year 2010. This will give Al Kaly a profit of approximately \$7,000! More importantly the Units and Clubs earned approximately \$10,000 for their Cash Calendar Raffle Sales!

This year we will print approximately 1,600 calendars to sell and they will be available for sale probably the first week in November at a retail of \$25.00. The Units and Clubs will earn \$7.00 per calendar sold this year, an increase of .75¢ per calendar sold!

We will contact the Unit and Club representatives soon asking for your support in sponsoring a page for the calendar. The cost to sponsor a page is \$250 and your unit picture or collage will appear on the month you choose. Your Unit or Club picture will also be featured on the Al Kaly internet site at www.alkalyshrine.org the entire month that you sponsor. Thank you for your support for the Cash Calendar and thanks in advance for your support for the 2011 Raffle Calendar. It is very much appreciated.




SUMMER EVENTS

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
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SEE US AT THE COLORADO STATE FAIR

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

If you happened to go to the Stock Shows at the El Paso County Fair in the last few years you may have heard Kyle doing the announcing, and yes, he takes that sense of humor wherever he goes. As I spoke with him today, he told me that he had been selected to compete in the National Forensic Tournament in Kansas City in June. Kyle looks at the Cerebral Palsy, not as a barrier but a challenge. He has overcome all of this with the help of his God given talents and gifts. When you look at the Potentate's Directory you will see the Units listed, with something for everyone: Music (Band, Oriental Band and Pipe and Drum Corps), Animals (Mule Train), Sports (Bowling Unit), Motorcycles, etc. (Potentate's Escort, Elite and Honda Patrol), Outdoors type (Nomads), Entertaining (two Clown Units), Little Cars (Corvettes, Little Ts and Tin Lizzies), Classic Cars (Flivvers), Military Background (Legion of Honor) and there is a Wood Carving Unit, the Fremont Tractors and a Diving Unit.


